10 points to keep in mind to be understood by everyone

- 1 Introduce yourself and remind the person of the reason for the discussion.
- 2 Ask the person if they would like support from someone.
- Remove distractions: phone, etc.
- Maintain eye contact with the person, even if you need to search for information or take notes.
- Do not make assumptions about the person's level of literacy and knowledge.

 Take into account the context of their life.
- Speak clearly; use well-known words and explain terms.
- Give up to three pieces of information, in order of importance.
- Target concrete actions and use real examples.
- Reinforce the message with material that the person can keep: notes, videos, etc.
- Encourage the person to ask questions and rephrase what they have understood.

"I don't know how well I have explained. Can you tell me in your own words how you're going to do it?"
