Presentation

Results

- After a short welcoming and introduction, DE presents information about the transnational governance and FR about the updated algorithm (see attached presentation).
- In particular the following questions were asked/answered in the first round of questions (summary):

Questions

- Timeline for the next update of the algorithm?
- Topics of the next update (fruit and vegetable (FVL) component, portion size) of the algorithm?
- First results of the revision of the FVL component?
- Cooperation of the Scientific Committee (ScC) with the EU?
- Activities to promote the Nutri-Score at EU level
- Priority of the COEN should be to find more FBOs to support the Nutri-Score, not to optimize the algorithm.
- Stability is important. Frequent changes of the algorithm lead to increased costs for packaging updates.
- List of all FBO that participate in Nutri-Score?
- Separation between original and updated algorithm in the FAQ document would be helpful.

Answers

- No timeline set yet. Probably in several years.
- Basis of the system is to calculate with 100 g or ml, there will be no change to portion size.
- ScC is working on evaluation of the FVL component, can't share results yet, but this will be part of the next revision.
- At this moment there is no progress on EU level. We are waiting for the next EU Commission.
- ➤ We agree that it is preferred that many FBOs use Nutri-Score, but at the same it is also important to better align Nutri-Score with the dietary guidelines.
- We understand that changes are a lot of work for FBOs. That is why it will probably last some years before the next update will be implemented.

- With regard to the FAQ document we are open for suggestions for improvement
- FR presents information about the transition period and all COEN present responses to questions from stakeholders (see attached presentation).
- In an open question and answer session at the end, the following questions in particular were asked/answered (summary):

Questions

 COEN have to advocate stronger for a EU FOPNL on mandatory level.

- Consumer communication to keep on explaining the logo is needed.
- A campaign could be financially be co-funded by the companies?
- Is it possible for countries to share communication tools to ensure that everyone can benefit, especially those with limited resources or budgets?
- Are there plans for educational material targeted at children about the Nutri-Score?

- With regard to the delay in France of the decree and of the transition period, raising the question of whether a modification or extension could be granted.
- Can France be more flexible and for example allow new product to use the updated algorithm?
- Are there plans to organize more forums to allow companies to engage and collaborate?
- o Are there intentions of an in person meeting?
- Are there plans for a single point of contact for FBOs in all COENs?

Answers

- At this moment there is no progress on EU level. We are waiting for the next EU Commission. Nevertheless, the COEN are still committed to the introduction of the Nutri-Score in the EU and favor the Nutri-Score as currently the most effective FOP-NL for Europe. The strategy of engaged countries to Nutri-Score regarding the EU harmonization is discussed within the Steering committee.
- There are numerous information materials available in the individual COENs. The COENs will examine how these can best be linked, an exchange is already taking place where required.
- ➤ The COENs are happy to receive information on any special needs and welcome information campaigns by FBOs as well.
- For example, in France, FBOs will have access to the material developed by Sante publique France.

- ➤ In France the transition period has not started yet. France is finding out what is possible.
- As part of the preparations for the next User Forum, COEN will check further opportunities for collaboration and whether an in-person meeting is possible.
- Answering the FBOs' questions is very timeconsuming, which is why there is an address in each COEN to ensure that answers are provided as promptly as possible.
- ➤ If necessary, the COENs forward questions from FBOs to each other or consult the Steering or Technical Committee before providing feedback to ensure a harmonised response.
